



Resolution 11-19-18

Guideline for dealing with charges for proposed subdivisions where DEP permits are not obtained within 5 years of plan submission to AWS

- When subdivision plans are submitted to AWS for review, and plan review fees are paid, the review shall be valid for a period of 5 years from the date of submission to AWS.
- If the infrastructure has not been installed and accepted within 5 years from the date of submission to AWS, the resubmitted plans shall meet all current design criteria as authorized by AWS.
- If the submitter has not received a DEP permit, and a request is made to AWS for a subsequent plan review to begin the development order process again, the subdivision per lot plan review and inspection fees in place at that time shall be charged.
- The subdivision per lot plan review and inspection fees will not be charged again for the resubmission if they were paid at the time of the original submission.
- Non-refundable deposit fees: If the capacity replacement fees (25% of the total costs) have been paid, the DEP permit issued, and the subdivision is not constructed within the 5-year DEP permit window, the following shall apply:
 - Since the capacity replacement fees (25%) require AWS to set aside capacity for the subdivision, these fees expire after the 5-year DEP permit window has expired and cannot be carried over to the resubmitted plans.
 - Should the request for re-submission for new DEP permit be requested, the capacity replacement fees (25%) shall be required as if with a new submission.
 - This guideline shall be effective for any subdivision which is reviewed after the effective date approved by the AWS Board of Directors
